Headmistress' Speech



PRIZE GIVING ADDRESS

Greetings, one and all.

I take the opportunity, at the outset of my address, to acknowledge the presence of our former headmistress, Mrs Meyer, and her deputy headmistress, Mrs Cartwright. It is an honour to have you both here.

I would also like to extend a warm welcome to our three "Old Girls": Ruvimbo Chapwanya, Amorie Liebenberg and Karin Schutte - all three, Matriculants of 2018, and each of whom will be assisting with the handing out of prizes this afternoon. It is truly delightful to have you here with us.

Good afternoon to you, members of our School Governing Body, Parents, our Educator, Administrative and Support Staff, Learners, and in particular - a sincere and heartfelt salutation to our Matric Class of 2022.

I want you all to close your eyes... and imagine... imagine a school where the intentions to inspire create a far-reaching impact? If you have not already done so, open your eyes... Ladies and gentlemen... may I boldly assert that throughout the course of this year, we have not just imagined that this should be our mission, rather we have constantly and consistently endeavoured to make it our reality!

At the High School for Girls, Potchefstroom, we are under no illusion that things are absolutely perfect. They are not! However, not for one iota of a second does this deter us from persistently striving towards reaching our goals, pushing towards our visions and doing our utmost to achieve our dreams.

As you are all well aware: This year's theme has centred on four words: IMAGINE, INTEND, INSPIRE and IMPACT - with each word forming the focus of each term.

In the final analysis, I believe that what I share with you this afternoon, will reveal the sort of impact that each and every stakeholder has had, and indeed contributed towards, the triumphs of this year.

Moreover, let us not lose sight of the fact that it has been three years since our last whole-school prize giving. And here we are, after two years of having to navigate a "new normal" during the Covid-19 Pandemic, where watchwords like quarantine, facemask, lockdown, self-isolating, and the dreaded distance learning, became



part of our everyday lives. And then, just as swiftly, as we entered 2022, with the snap of our proverbial fingers, we were thrust into normalcy, again...

2022 has been like no other year. We hit the ground running at our school, and quite honestly we have not stopped. And this afternoon, we are proud to be able to bask in the reflected glory of the brilliance and talent of so many determined, steadfast and hardworking young women!

Notwithstanding the toll of Covid-19, our school boasts a student body of 541 learners – indicative of the fact that despite the apparent appeal of online learning, nothing beats the provision of face-to-face teaching!

In January this year, we were thrilled, and indeed proud, to announce that our matriculation class of 2021 achieved a 100% pass rate, with a 95% university exemption – our highest ever!

Bearing in mind that the class of 2021 had to endure two years of Covid-19; the resilience of our educators and learners ensured and secured a wonderful set of results! Whilst we highlighted the matric top achievers, we also acknowledge the hard work and personal accomplishments of each and every Matric learner, and acknowledge the dedication and commitment they displayed towards their learning.

This group of girls amassed 186 distinctions in total, and out of 106 Matrics, 26 achieved aggregates of 80% or higher, with six obtaining distinctions in each of their subjects.

Our top scholar, Marle Siebert, with an average of 92, 7%, was also the top Mathematics and Physical Science

learner in the North West Province.

This was not the only accolade bestowed upon us as a result of our class of 2021's performance. The High School for Girls, Potchefstroom was awarded FIRST PLACE for being the Top performing school in Quintile 4 at the 2022 National Education Excellence Awards Ceremony in April this year.

It is imperative that I point out that an outstanding set of results was not obtained by our Matrics alone, but from the school as a whole. And what has been particularly significant throughout this year, is to record the constant improvement of each grade's average as the year has progressed. A testament to the Growth Mind Set Approach initiated by you, Mrs Meyer, which we still firmly drive at our school, and which I can attest to having had an indelible impact on the manner in which our learners embrace the motto: hard work brings true joy!

The Growth Mind-set Approach underpins our Quality Learning and Teaching Campaign, and since its implementation in 2016, we have been able to boast a SIX PERCENT improvement across all grade averages over the last six years!!!

Whilst we experienced one of our greatest misfortunes this year, with the absence of an FET Mathematics Educator from early August, we were able to eventually surmount this blight with the help and support from our Provincial Department of Education, thereby securing the transfer of Miss Myburgh, who has, in the space of the shortest possible time ensured that our Matrics are ready to write their Final Examinations.

I would also, in his absence, like to acknowledge the services of Mathematics Tutor, Stefan De Beer, who assisted our Matrics prior to their Preparatory Examinations, and then again in the last week of Term 3.

Special mention must also be made of

the manner in which Mrs Strydom and Mrs Ferreira stepped in to deliver what came to be known as Community Maths, to our Grade 10 and 11 learners. These two educators were also most generously assisted by the incredible mentorship of Mrs Sue Cartwright. Mrs Cartwright, we thank you for your unfailing guidance.

To be honest, one of the hallmarks of our school is our devoted and dedicated educators, who all go the extra mile for our learners, and who work incredibly hard to develop and unleash the potential of every girl.

What is more, we now have a PhD Graduate among them: Congratulations, Dr Djan, whose doctorate was accomplished in the field of Natural Science Education. I wish to present to you, Dr Djan, a bouquet of flowers from the school as a token of our well wishes on your outstanding accomplishment!

There is another very special lady I would like to acknowledge today: Mrs Coetzee. Mrs Coetzee is retiring at the end of 2022, after 32 years, a true testimony of her dedication to this organisation. Mrs Coetzee, at this special occasion, I would like to acknowledge your many years of service to our school both as Head of the Afrikaans Department and for your contribution to the development of music at our school – particularly regarding the choir. We are also grateful for your years of service on the School Management Team. We would like you to know how valued you are for all your contributions, and we wish you blessings in abundance as you embark upon a new stage your life. Please receive this bouquet of flowers as a token of our love and appreciation.

Whilst academic performance and curriculum coverage will always remain

our greatest priority, the co-curricular programme at our school is one which encourages participation and performance. Under the efficient and enthusiastic management of our Co-Curricular Co-ordinator, Mrs Kemp, we have had an impressive and jam-packed programme this year, which incorporated Inter-House events including the Inter House Gala; Inter-House Athletics; Derby Week; the Inter-House Cross Country; the Play Festival and Drama Gala, as well as General Knowledge Quizzes in the first, second and third terms. All these events contribute towards the accumulation of house points as Adventure, Discovery and Quest battle it out for the coveted Cock House Trophy.

Thankfully, this year has allowed us to participate in multiple derby days, festivals, tournaments, league matches and clinics in all our traditional sports. Each week, our Communique has showcased the participation and accomplishments of our girls in Athletics, Biathlon, Chess, Cross Country, Hockey, Netball, Tennis, Squash and Swimming – where a noteworthy mention must be made of three of our swimmers who participated in the Botswana Swimming Sports Association Botswana National Championships at the start of the year.

We are also very proud of our Majorettes who had one of the longest seasons ever, culminating in their participation at the National Championships in Polokwane in early October - the first National Championship since July 2019. The team has been steered by Mrs Ferreira, who was also appointed as Mentor Coach for the North-West girls in the National Team.

Our wholehearted congratulations is extended to two young Majorettes, Mokgabo Lechesa and Keisha Brishmaer, who were selected to represent South Africa, under the auspices of the South African Majorette and Cheerleading Association (SAMCA), at the Majorette World Championships in Zagreb, Croatia. Moreover, SASCOC approved the awarding of Protea Colours to all members of the touring team.

We continue to boast representation by several learners at Provincial and National level, in multiple codes - both those offered within the school, as well as outside of school activities. These include: Athletics, Ballet, Equestrian, Karate, Hockey, Majorettes, Netball, Squash, Swimming and Tennis.

The Wellness Centre, most remarkably overseen by our school Biokineticist, Miss Wessels, continues to offer ALL our learners the resources to develop a healthy lifestyle, which will provide them with the ability and confidence to be physically active throughout their lives.

In the sphere of culture, aside from our inter-house events, our aspiring actresses found expression in both the junior and senior Tienertoneels, our choir performed with gusto at the Gimmies Eisteddfod, where they achieved an A; our Vocal Ensemble also performed at the Gimmies Eisteddfod and achieved an A+, and went on to obtaining three A+ certificates at the Mmino Festival in August. Our Marimba Bands (junior and senior) must be acknowledged for the A++ certificates they

achieved at the Gimmies Eisteddfod. They also participated in the Allegretto Inter-Provincial Eisteddfod in July, and because of their outstanding results, were invited to a Gala Evening hosted at Potchefstroom Gimnasium, where they obtained a Special Award in acknowledgement of their inter-provincial involvement. Furthermore, these bands participated in the *International Marimba and Steel Pan Festival*, where they accomplished a second place in the category "In the Mix".

During the October break, we had learners who went on a Cultural Enrichment Tour to France, as well as a group of six other learners who were selected on the basis of their academic performance, to participate in a Tour to the USA.

Our school also continues to acknowledge and recognise the importance of Wellness. I think it is significant to highlight that Wellness Week was first introduced to Girls High in 2017. For the last five years – even during the COVID-19 period - our school has used this week to highlight the dimensions of spiritual, emotional and physical wellness, as well as our efforts as a school to emphasise the importance of the development, and sustaining of, the mind-body connection to foster personal growth and support mental and emotional wellness.

With a narrow window of opportunity to rethink our world after the COVID-19 pandemic, social workers around the world identified their theme for 2022 as being: 'Co-building a New Eco-Social World: Leaving No One Behind'. It is specifically this idea of co-building – Teamwork, if you will - that was used by Mrs van Sittert, our very own on-site social worker and her intern, Miss Groenewald, to inform their co-coordinating of this year's Wellness Week.

The theme presented a vision and action plan to create new values, policies and

practices that develop trust, security and confidence for all people. Moreover, Wellness Week, and the activities that formed part of this week were woven into our Quality Learning and Teaching Campaign. As a public School, we are obliged to align ourselves with this national intervention, which is intended to mobilise stakeholders to collaborate with schools in promoting and delivering a culture of quality teaching and learning in schools.

It is again in this spirit, that Mrs van Sittert and Miss Groenewald sourced members of our local community to come in and speak to our staff and learners on the various dimensions of Wellness. It is our strongest hope that this week has in some way contributed towards our girls grasping just how important it is to nurture one's personal responsibility for one's own holistic health. And it is because we recognise the importance of this that we have secured the services of a second school-based social worker, who will form part of our support staff in 2023.

Over and above the pillars of academics, sport and culture, as well as our emphasis on an holistic approach towards our learners, Service remains a significant component of our school. In 2022, our girls continued to firmly uphold our traditions of the blanket competition, blood donation and charity collection, as well as Mandela Week and a variety of outreach undertakings through Interact.

I think it is significant to share with you today that our Grade 8 to 12 homeroom classes amassed a staggering total of R41 639, 60, which will be used towards the purchase of items for various charities that will be donated to these organisations at our annual Children's Day, and our girls knitted sufficient strips to put together a

total of 274 whole blankets!

Yes, this year, we really got to do so many of the things that fill our usual yearly programme – unlike the previous two years! We even got to hold our Grade Camps!

I'm sure you will agree that it has been an exceptionally busy and event-filled year! None of which could have been possible without the exceptional help and support of our Deputy Headmistresses, Miss Scholtz and Mrs Human – Masters of logistics and planning. Thank you for helping to steer the Executive Management of our school.

To our School Management Team, thank you for helping to guide, support and provide sound council throughout the course of this year.

I would also like to acknowledge our School Governing Body, and the role they have played in the governance of our school, under the chairmanship of Mrs Hodgson, whose tenure ends with her daughter's matriculation.

Thank you for directing us through important financial and policy decisions, for also upholding the light of transformation, and for ensuring that despite the years of Covid, and the impact it has had on our school finances, we have managed to still ensure the provision of outstanding facilities through the carrying out of maintenance and improvement projects to our school grounds and hostels. We are equally grateful for your support of our determination to remain front-runners when it comes to technology, by continuously endorsing that we review and upgrade our IT systems to ensure that our girls have access to ICT platforms and competencies. I extend my sincere and

heartfelt thanks to each and every one of you, because you have been extremely important to the sustained success of our school during this year.

In fact, it is all our parents who are instrumental to the success of our school. I fully acknowledge that, and convey my thanks to you all. A special thank you to our Grade 12 parents who are with us for the last time this afternoon. Your involvement has made a difference to our school over the years and we thank you.

Finally, Matrics of 2022, you are also embarking upon and preparing for a new phase in your life... I encourage you to walk away from here and seize every opportunity with which you may be presented. I urge you never to lose sight of the values you learned here – and that you always bear in mind that the higher purpose and true mark of education is to contribute in some way to the community of which you are a part. It is my sincere hope that when you move towards your future, you do so as proud Girls High girls. I believe the world is ready for you – go out there and make your impact!

As the prodigious American poet and educator HW Longfellow asserted,

"Creat is the art of beginning, but greater is the art of ending"

Thus in conclusion, dear dignitaries, distinguished guests, families, friends, colleague, Matrics of 2022 and girls, we have heard it stated so many times, that – "Life is a journey". However, it is not a singular journey, it is a journey that is much more than just movement from one place to another. Journeys are about learning and growth; they have the potential to teach people about themselves and the society in which they live. And, whilst every person attaches a different meaning to their journey, ticks off a multitude of routes along the way, and may have a different destination, we should never lose sight of the strong bonds we form, the new skills we learn and the lasting memories we create.

Savour, cherish and treasure each experience as it contributes towards a life well lived, a life in which you should never be afraid of greatness – because, as today's Award's Ceremony will bear testament, and in the indelible words of William Shakespeare:

Some are born great, some achieve greatness, and others have greatness thrust upon them.

PRIZE GIVING ADDRESS - Hannia Kempen

"I cannot fix on the hour, or the spot, or the look, or the words, which laid the foundation. It was too long ago. I was in the middle before I knew that I had begun."

Jane Austen wrote these words in her novel, *Pride and Prejudice*, as Mr Darcy was attempting to explain when he fell in love. Though I have no inclination to make my own romantic declaration of love, I do want to borrow her idea that most things that matter end up happening before we realise they matter, and that is certainly true of the last year.

I've struggled with articulating my feelings about my time at this school for weeks. I want to tell you the expected story of how I

Just like Mr Darcy, I cannot fix on the exact moment where I realised that belonging is the people waiting to greet you in homeroom even though you do not have the same favourite song, or your athletics team hugging you when you did not win. It is in the words you suddenly have the courage to say and the love you finally feel you deserve, and the love you can now give to those around you, freely. This belonging is something that I have only ever found at Girls High, despite searching for the same feeling everywhere I go. I consider the discovery my biggest success.



For this reason, the last year, even with its burdens and responsibilities, has felt like a privilege bigger than I could have anticipated. It has helped me grow in ways I am only beginning to understand, and that is only because of the people who have surrounded me. I ask you to allow me to express my gratitude to as many as possible, even though words will never be enough.

Ms Duganzich, it has been the greatest honour to work so closely alongside you. Thank you for taking the time to address even the smallest of concerns and for allowing us so much space to fight for what we believed in. Thank you for the Vitamin F and thank you for every Monday motivation. You are an inspiration to me and many others sitting here today, and knowing you are in charge of the institution we leave behind instils hope for the future of its learners.

To every single educator, coach and member of staff that has played a role in helping us grow over the past five years, thank you. I am immensely grateful for every class, every greeting in the hallways, every nod of encouragement and every minute you have dedicated to making the school a more joyful space. The influence of a good teacher can never be erased, and I hope that we, as a school but most especially a matric form, will make your efforts worthwhile.

I don't even know where to start when it comes to my deputies Pabi and Mwewa, both of whom have given their everything alongside me this year. I don't even think we are close to the grade elevens who fought about matric jackets, or the grade tens who screamed at each other or the grade nines who did not know

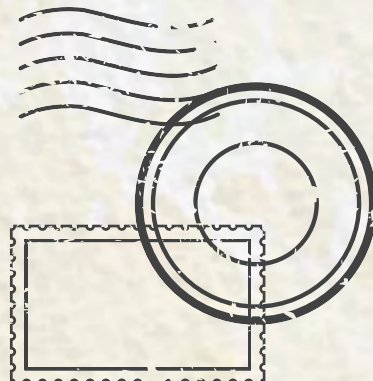

What would Paradise be without its revitalising ocean breeze?

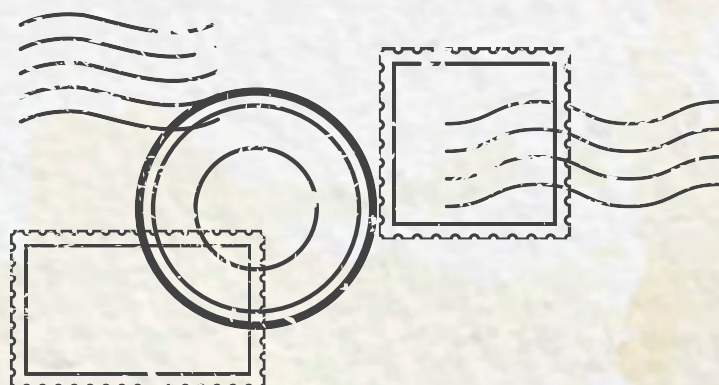
The inquisitiveness of the **grade 9** form certainly carried this distinct breeze throughout our hostel as their constant questions brought a new perspective to life.

cake sessions always felt and all the interesting stories you always shared about your exciting ventures. You are truly an exceptional woman and an excellent role model.

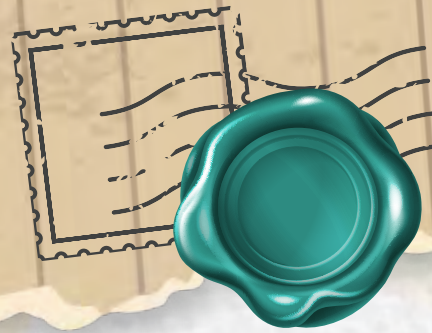

MISS ROSENHOF *Ms C Gray*

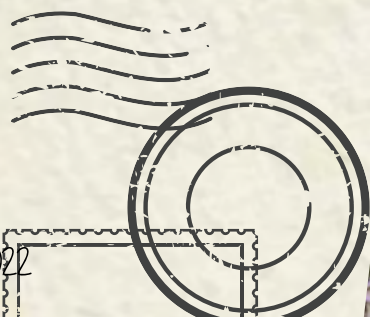

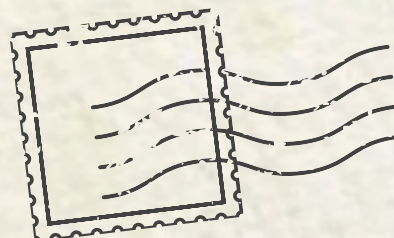

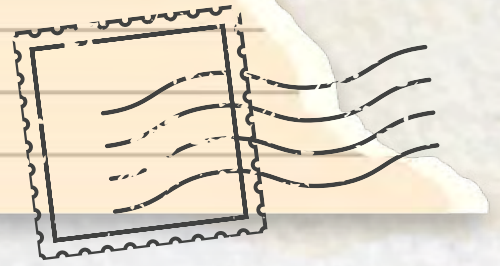
My Quest Family, you have made all the prayers, the hard-work, the sweat and the tears worthwhile and for that I would not trade you for anything.

This is the house that built me and I want to burn it down. The paint is chipping; my bedroom door can no longer lock. Screams echo the hallway. Sometimes, they are my own.

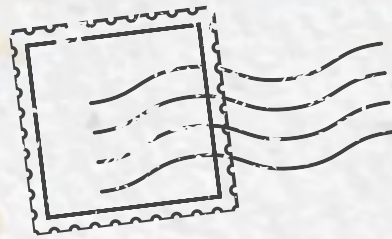

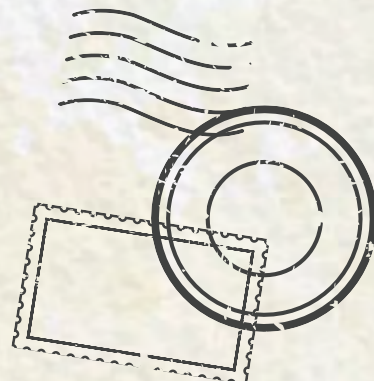
the ground. Leaving empty handed taught me to never wait again.
